Tuition and fees 100% refund deadlines

Know your refund deadlines! Session B's 100% refund deadline is March 22, 2026. After this date, tuition and fees are nonrefundable and students are required to pay that session's class charges, despite any withdrawals. Certain registration fees are nonrefundable on or after the first day of the semester. For additional information, please see the [tuition refund policy](#).

Understand your chapter of benefits

VA education benefits vary in how they pay and how much. Chapter 33 and Chapter 31 are the only VA education benefits that pay tuition and fees directly to the school. All others provide a monthly stipend to the student intended to cover their tuition and fees. If you need more information on your benefits, [please visit the VA website](#).

Tuition and fee deferments

Students who establish eligibility and choose to use benefits each semester receive a tuition deferment. The due dates for the deferment are as follows:

Fall semesters: Dec. 25

Spring semesters: May 25

Summer semesters: Aug. 25

ASU unpaid charges email

If you received an unpaid charges email and your tuition and fees have been deferred, you might want to check prior semesters' balances. Oftentimes this email is sent when students have small balances from prior terms, not the current term.
